Dear Parents and Carers,

Updates on the building team.

The scaffolding around school is enabling a detailed survey of the building structure to ensure no further areas of school need repairs. In the next few weeks, a toilet block is going to be erected on the front of school and safety fencing around these, to keep our children safe. This is to allow the builders to repair part of the building where the toilets in the main school area are.

There will also be a small partitioned wall in the corners of the main entrance and my office.

We are temporarily creating a classroom space for Y1 which will be in the front section of EYFS. This will enable the children in Y1 to have the correct outdoor space for their continuous provision and they will access the main playground for breaks and lunchtime play.

As any new information is shared with us, we will keep you informed.

Transition and classes for September 2026.

Transition starts for all children on the 29 June 2026. During this week, our Year 6 children will be spending time in their secondary schools. Once they return, we will be calling them Year 7. They will be based in the library, and making full use of the additional spaces we are fortunate to have, such as the art studio.

Once the year comes to an end we will be saying goodbye to Mrs White as she retires. Mr Gogh will be the full time teacher in the Y5/6 class. As our Y6 class, is small, some Y5 children will be in this class and it will be based on their date of birth, with the oldest children in with Y6.

We will also be saying goodbye to Mrs Smith who is moving to another school in September. We are currently recruiting the next teacher to job share in Y3 for two days and for one day in Y1, with Mrs Marsh. We are also recruiting the next Y4/5 teacher for September.

Currently Mrs Savory and Mrs Smith are both absent from school and we will notify you when they are returning. Where possible we are having our own staff to cover these classes and where needed having additional supply agency staff.

We are growing in numbers and are able to have separate classes for Y1, 2 and 3 this year. It is hoped this pattern works its way through school as more families move into the village.

If your child is in a class with mixed year groups, we will ensure that you know which class through the transition booklets they bring home today. This will support you visiting the next class and teacher during Transition and Show Time on the 16 June at 3:30 until 6:00pm.

Why mixed classes?

Mixed classes offer a number of educational benefits, including:

- **Exceptional Learning:** Teachers can group children by ability or interest, allowing for more personalised learning and targeted support.
- **Take Care of ourselves, Social Development:** Children have the opportunity to work with a wider range of peers, building confidence, cooperation, and friendships across year groups.
- **Take Care of each other, Leadership Opportunities:** Older children often enjoy helping younger classmates, which fosters responsibility and reinforces their own learning.

What does this mean for your child?

Your child will still follow the appropriate curriculum for their year group, taught by our dedicated and experienced staff. Lessons will be carefully planned to ensure every child is challenged and supported in their learning. Our teaching team have collectively been planning to meet the needs of all children, including which quality texts that each class will learn from; through to the artists they will study. We will continue to monitor progress closely and keep you informed throughout the year. Your child will still be with their year group for everything social, playtimes and lunchtimes. School visits and residential visits will still be as a year group with the added benefit of more children, as two or even three year groups will join for school visits and residential visits so the cost can be supported. We understand that any change can raise questions, and we are here to support both you and your child as we make this transition. If you would like to discuss this in more detail, please do not hesitate to contact us and we will arrange a meeting with you, to answer any

questions. The early transition we have done for some years now and we will focus this time in developing the bonds for the class with each other and their teaching teams. We are confident that this change will bring positive outcomes for all children and strengthen our school community even further. Thank you, as always, for your continued support.
